Good day,

We are presenting this application to The Commission of Inquiry into the Historic Losses of Land on behalf of the Descendants of the late James Richardson. There have been on-going issues in reference to the Richardson Trust and the land in question.

The land, is located on the South Road in Paget. Part of the property is located to the south of south road, on the same side as the Coral Beach and Tennis Club and the other part of the property, now known as Honey Hill, is located on the northern side of south road, opposite of Coral Beach and Tennis Club (See plot plans 1&2).


In total, there are approximately 20 acres in question. The land was subject to a court case in 1932, where the applicant at that time, Catherine Amanda Williams, the daughter of James Richardson, a relative of the current applicants, was told by the Supreme Court that she was to take possession of the land in question. Catherine Amanda Williams passed away shortly after the court case and never took possession of the land and therefore never received any documents for the land (See DI 1).

In 2010, relatives of Catherine Amanda Williams, brought forward another court case against the Trustees of the Richardson Trust. (See attached Supreme Court document # 392).

Based on the 1932 Judgement from the Supreme Court of Bermuda, we the Descendants of James Richardson and Catherine Amanda Williams, (nee Richardson) ask The Commission of Inquiry into the Historic Losses of Land to further investigate this outstanding matter.
