Re: The Will of Thomas Henry Smith

Dear Cousin Vivie:

There were many stories when we were growing up regarding our Papa's property at Cross Bay, Southampton that was willed to you and your brother Granville Trimmingham Wilson. We did ask questions about the authenticity of the Will but were never satisfied with the answers. Our mother, Louise Simmons (only daughter of Thomas Henry Smith) and others, had often asked for a copy of the Will and were told that you could not find it.

Just recently we have managed to get a copy of the Will of our grandfather, Thomas Henry Smith and our concerns have been verified as to the authenticity of our Papa's signature on the Will.

You may say, "Why regurgitate all of this now?" For one, the information needed has only recently been made available to us and we have sought legal consultation in regards to The Law of Wills & Estates In Bermuda. It is remembered that our Papa could not read or write and therefore we are very concern that the signature on the Will is not his signature. We do not consider it to be a forged signature but a fraudulent act on your behalf. The signature on the Will is much too legible from what we can remember of Papa's handwriting.

It is a known fact that our Papa was an alcoholic and had always been told that he was taken advantage of in that state. We remember that you use to have him living in your unfinished cellar enduring inhumane conditions. We also remember going to wash Papa's hair, take him bottles of soup so he can eat and all he slept on was a mattress that laid on a dirt floor. We still can't believe that you had him living in such a dilapidated state, thoughts that have hunted us all of our lives.





We now have proof in black and white and a copy of our Papa's Will is attached. We are sending you this letter in good conscience hoping that we can come together and clear the air so this matter can be settled once and for all and the right thing can be done on behalf of our mother, Louise Simmons.


