In the Name of God, Amen. I Robert Papett

of Sandy Parke in the Shire of Down Merchant being of sound mind and memory thanks be to God thereof, but being far advanced in years and labouring with infirmities from age, and knowing it is ordained for all Men once to die; do hereby in full and free will and full understanding in manner and form following, Declare as to say.

First and principally I recommend my soul to God who created it, relying on the intercession of Jesus Christ the Redeemer for the pardon of my transgressions and the attainment of eternal life, my body I commit to the earth to be buried in such manner as my Executors may see fit.

Secondly. It is my Will that as soon after my decease as may be consistent with convenience and decency, the whole of my personal property, my Negroes, furniture, and every other thing whatsoever, nothing excepted, be inventoried, appraised and sold in such manner as my Executors may see fit, and after paying my Funeral charges, and just debts the residue be carried into my Estate for division as hereafter directed.

Thirdly. It is my Will that the timber on the land where I now reside, that may be considered to be worth three shillings or more per acre or piece be marked, inventoried, appraised and sold in such manner, and at such time as my Executors may deem best for the interest of my Estate.

Fourthly. In order to make an equal division of my Estate as may be, it is my Will that my Executors should be authorized to appraise all my real Estate in manner and form following, that is to say, the land where I now live, about thirty acres with all the Improvements belonging thereto thereto, and the small timber on the same of three shillings, be considered as one lot; and my House or Barn shall be kept as one lot or divided in two Tenements, as I have found it necessary to do for some years, for the purpose of renting it; there is also a vacant lot described in a plat or plan of the Township by number thirty Eight, and there is part of W. Twenty which adjoins it in the Alley that leads by my House to second street, they may be appraised and sold together or separated as may be concluded to be most advisable, and it is my Will when the aforesaid Tenements be appraised that my Children be at liberty to choose by signing any one tenement for his own use at such appraisement and if any part or the whole of such property be rejected at such appraisement, that the same be sold by my Executors for the benefit of my Estate.

Fifthly. As soon as the State Account of my whole Estate both Real and Personal can be ascertained including Bonds Notes, and accounts, as well with my Children and Grand Children, as all other Chests, nothing excepted, I give and bequeath to my two Grand Children Messrs. Robert Papett and John Papett the sum of £1000.00 and the same to be paid to them or their Executors, and the residue of the whole or the value thereof

thing to be equally divided between them, to share and share alike in the said one eighth part,
 And I give and bequeath to my Grand son, Josiah Tucker one eighth part of my Estate or the value thereof for his own use and behoof, and I give and bequeath the remaining three fourth parts of my Estate to my three surviving Children Elizabeth Tucker, Sophie Nash and Jane Hayward for their own proper use and behoof.
 And lastly, I revoke all other Wills by me at any time heretofore made and declare this my last Will and Testament, and I appoint my trusty and beloved friends that is to say my son in Law Benjamin Sawyer Hayward and my son in Law Robert Barth Tucker, in his decease to my Estate the amount of his Bond for money I paid for his account, and as my Daughter Sophie Nash has no one to call for her I appoint my said Daughter Sophie Nash as Executor hereunto.
 In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at the top of the first page and my hand at the bottom of the second and third page and my hand and seal at the bottom of this fourth page this nineteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and nineteen.

Codicil.

Whereas by the fifth clause in the third page of this my last Will and Testament, among other things I have given and granted unto my Daughters Elizabeth Tucker, Sophie Nash and Jane Hayward three fourth parts of my Estate both Real and Personal as therein set forth; Now being remembered and understood that my will and intention is (that in the event of the death of my said Daughters or either of them previous to this my Will going into effect that such proportion shall descend to the children of such deceased Daughter or Daughters to be equally divided among them respectively and in the event of only one child then to such surviving child. Witness my hand and seal this third day of May in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty.
