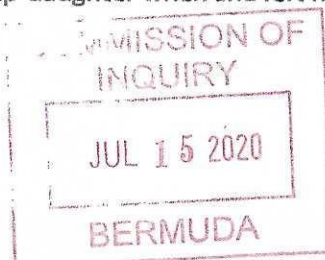


Fred Sr. has accumulated a lot of properties and wealth over his lifetime. As Fred Sr. had one biological child, Fred Jr., we intend to prove that Fred Sr. always intended that his only biological son would benefit from his estate. Due to the combination of Fred Jr. massive stroke in 1987 and the step-daughters' intent on excluding him from his father's life, there is an obvious belief that Fred Sr. would want his son to benefit from his estate.

Most recent events since Fred Sr. was removed from his home in early 2012

1. Shortly after Fred Jr. death, his wife Vera called Carol-Ann Furbert to say that Fred Sr. had told his son that he would help him with cash and a property since Vera had just been retired by her company. Carol-Ann was very flustered and said she was having difficulty paying her own mortgage and she would have to speak to her sister in Canada. A week later Vera called again and left a message on her answering machine. There was no response from Carol-Ann but the next day Albertha Greene called from Canada and said Vera was to stop contacting them.
2. Fred Jr. passed away at home on August 22nd after a visit to his father at Elder Home Care along with his wife Vera and Fred Sr.'s two nieces, Betty Ann Hendrickson and Mary Ann Lindsey. During that visit Fred Sr. was adamant that Fred Jr. needed to bring a truck and collect his furniture and take him home.
3. On November 20, 2012 Justin was advised by Deborah Correia from Wakefield Quin that on September 20, 2012 she had prepared a letter outlining what had happened to date to Fred Sr. for the Victims Unit of the Police concerning elder abuse and financial abuse by the step-daughters which was to be submitted by Mary Ann Lindsey, Fred Sr. niece.
4. Fred Sr. grandson, Justin, went with his father Fred Jr. to the Elder Home Care on July 6, 2012 to see Fred Sr. but he was told by Mrs. Trott in a very hostile manner, that he couldn't.
5. On May 25th 2012 Fred Jr. and his wife Vera, Betty Burch and Mary Ann Lindsey (Fred Sr.'s Nieces), met with Dennis Dwyer and Deborah Correia of Wakefield Quin to pursue Fred Sr. situation. From that meeting three letters were prepared by Dennis Dwyer as per attached copies.
6. Early May 2012 Fred Jr. and his wife Vera submitted an application to Legal Aid so that Fred could pursue his concern that his father had been left at the Elder Care Facility in Devonshire as he felt he was more than capable of living in his own home with a caregiver. Even though Fred Jr. only income was financial assistance Legal Aid turned down the application based on his wife's income.
7. Fred Jr. and his wife went to see Fred Sr. on May 7th at the Elder Home Care and the manager Mrs. Trott said that he only had two daughters and didn't believe he had a son and asked them to leave. Fred Jr. spotted his father Fred Sr. and they had a good visit.
8. When one of Fred Sr.'s nieces Donna Hendrickson was working at the Elder Home Care, Fred Sr. told her that he had been 'duped' by his step-daughter when she left him there and he wanted to see his son and wanted to go home.



9. A Hendrickson relative that works at the Mid Atlantic Wellness Facility said that Fred Sr. was taken there from his home in Flatts by the Police in hand cuffs and his step-daughter tried to have him committed. From there he was taken directly to The Elder Care Facility in Devonshire and left there. Mrs. Trott said to Fred Jr. and his wife that when the step-daughter came to see Fred Sr. he became violent and tried to hit and kick her. She never returned to see him after. He was distraught that he had no access to a telephone or any means to contact anyone. In anger, he would push his furniture against the door in his room so the staff were unable to get in.

11. On April 23, 2012 Fred Jr., Vera, Betty Hendrickson Burch & Mary Ann Lindsey (Fred Sr.'s nieces) met with Deborah Correia at Betty Hendrickson Burch's house to express their concerns about the treatment of Fred Sr. who had been left at the Elder Home Care Facility in Devonshire.

Prior to Fred Jr. massive stroke in 1987, his father and him were both in the construction business and had an ongoing relationship. Fred Jr. never fully recovered from the massive stroke in 1987 and had ongoing speech and movement impediments which prevented him from continuing to work. For several years he was unable to communicate due to his speech impediments and unable to use his right hand or walk properly. Fred Sr. tried to assist him with saving his house, but unfortunately due to interference from Fred Jr. daughter the house was forced to be sold. Shortly after Fred Jr. lost his house in 1994 Fred Sr. and his nephew, Harry Hendrickson, Jr. visited Fred Jr. at our North Shore Road apartment to see how Fred Jr. was doing and talk about the Hendrickson apartments on Dundonald Street. Once Fred Jr. regained enough abilities to function in the world, Justin and him visited Fred Sr. when he was living in an apartment in one of his houses nearby his main house in Flatts. In conversation Fred Jr. asked his father for \$500,000 to help support him and his wife. Fred Sr. said he would be able to help once he got his settlement from the Arnold Todd court case which would be approximately that amount. In the mid 2000's Fred Sr.'s grandson, Justin, went with two Hendrickson cousins to see his grandfather at 38 Clarendon Road in Flatts to see when Fred Sr. would fulfill his obligation to help his handicapped son. He was turned away by Carol-Ann Furbert who said his grandfather was in the bedroom sleeping. As we were leaving the yard she came outside and said he did want to see us and it was obvious that he hadn't been sleeping. She stayed in the room to listen to the conversation.
