I do not know when Lemuel Norman Tucker obtained the land, but I

do know that when our grandmother **Jessie Rosalie Crockwell** (born "Tucker") was a child she and her parents and siblings lived on *Chapel Road* in Paget (in the house that I assume the Kirk family still live in...Mr Kirk is a teacher, doubtless retired now, who was our Boys' Brigade leader at St. Paul's, and whose son Adam was the room mate of our older brother *Michel A*. "*Tony*" *Crockwell-Laurent* in the 1990s). This was close to the family's grocery store (the small building on the northern side of *Ord Road*, and on the western side of Tribe Road No. 4...which is called "*Southcote Road*" between Ord Road and South Shore Road, then forms part of South Shore Road, then the public access road to Elbow Beach...see: 32°16'42.6"N 64°46'55.1"W). At a later date, Lemuel Norman Tucker owned and lived in the house on the northern side of the main entrance to Faraways (circled in **VIOLET** on the satellite photo: 32°16'06.3"N 64°47'35.2"W...it is marked as "*HOMESTEAD*" on Lot. No. 1 in the survey from his will, shown below), which he presumably moved into when he obtained the entire tract to the East of Southlands. As my grandmother was born in 1912 and lived her early years on Chapel Road, I assume this means her father obtained the land on Dunscombe Road in the 1920s. The Main Entrance to Faraways, incidentally, appears to have originally been an access road to Southlands directly from Dunscombe Road.
